A master class is an opportunity for students to perform in front of an audience and to work with a clinician. The clinician discusses and addresses various aspects of performance and studying, such as musical expression, technical challenges, practice strategies, and more. The audience learns from the clinician through observation. This is such a wonderful opportunity for voice students to experience feedback from a singer who is active in public performance.

It is also a great opportunity for teachers to observe and ask questions.

There should be room for approximately 8 students, and initially each teacher may submit two students.

However if we do not have enough students, teachers may be able to submit an additional student.

The masterclass is open to intermediate as well as advanced students.

Meet our Classical Voice Masterclass Clinician:

Lyric coloratura, Julianna Tauschinger-Dempsey came to singing after completing a year of fieldwork on Gypsies in France. Appropriately enough, the former anthropologist and professional Flamenco dancer would go on to make her operatic debut singing and dancing the role of Frasquita (Carmen) with the Boston Lyric Opera. In 2011, after a six-year hiatus, Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey made a triumphant return to the operatic stage singing her first Despina (Cosí fan tutte) and Adele (Die Fledermaus). As a young artist with the Zurich Opera, Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey sang the Erste Dame in Die Kinderzauberflöte (The Magic Flute for Children), Fiordiligi (Cosí fan tutte) and Anna Gomez in a German production of Menotti's The Consul.

Also an active concert artist, Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey first gained attention as the soprano soloist in Boston Pro Musica's performances of Verdi's Messa di Requiem and Beethoven's Mass in C under the baton of Jeffrey Rink. Recently, she performed Mozart's Regina Coeli, K. 127, with Schola Cantorum of Boston director, Frederick Jodry, and the Exsultate Jubilate with harpsichordist and early music director, Marcellene Hawk. A devoted student and performer of German Lieder and the French chanson, Ms. Tauschinger-Dempsey has given numerous recitals in her native Cleveland, as well as in Cambridge, Providence, New York City, and in and around Zurich, Switzerland.

She recently sang her first Susanna in the St. Petersburg Opera production of Mozart's brilliant Le Nozze di Figaro and has been the soprano soloist in Duke Chapel's annual Messiah under Rodney Wynkoop. The soprano received an honors degree in Social Anthropology from Harvard University and earned a Master's degree in voice with distinction from the Manhattan School of Music.
